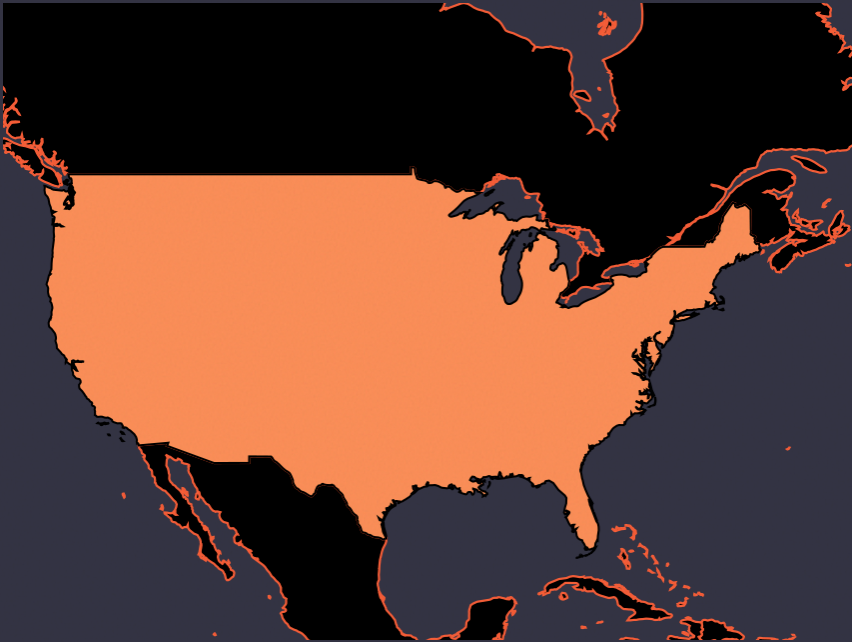

Washington DC

New York

Its geography, bisected by the River Hudson, defines its five boroughs: Manhattan, Brooklyn, Queens, the Bronx and Staten Island. This iconic city is home to such wonders as the Statue of Liberty, Central Park and Times Square.
