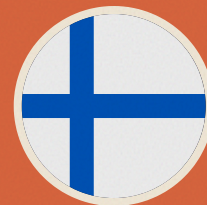

Helsinki

1.014.317 pop.

Helsinki is the capital and main city of Finland, located along the Baltic Sea. Its landscape combines islands, parks, historic buildings and modern architecture. Among its best-known landmarks are the cathedral, the sea fortress of Suomenlinna and the harbor. It is also the country's main political, economic, cultural and educational center, with a strong influence from Finnish culture.

Tampere

152.752 pop.

Tampere is an important city in central Finland, located between Lakes Näsijärvi and Pyhäjärvi. It grew rapidly during the Industrial Revolution thanks to its textile factories and hydroelectric power. Its former industrial facilities, now converted into museums, shops and cultural spaces, bear witness to that past. Today it is also a major university center, tech...

Turku

107.319 pop.

Turku is one of Finland's oldest cities and served as its capital until 1812. Located along the Aura River, it preserves significant evidence of its past, such as Turku Castle and its medieval cathedral. The city reflects Finland's historical ties with Sweden and today is also noted for its universities, cultural activity and connection to the Baltic archipelago.

Porvoo

51.464 pop.

Porvoo is one of Finland's prettiest historic towns. Its old town preserves narrow streets, wooden houses and traditional buildings, while the famous red houses by the river create a very distinctive image. Founded in the Middle Ages, the city reflects the historical coexistence of Finnish and Swedish cultures. Its peaceful atmosphere makes it an especially attractive place.

● GEOGRAPHY OF FINLAND

Lakes and forests

Finland is famous for its thousands of lakes and vast forests, which cover a large part of the territory. The landscape combines calm waters, islands, conifers and wild nature. This close relationship with forests and lakes is an essential part of the Finnish identity and has deeply influenced its culture, economy and way of life.

Lapland

Lapland occupies the far north of Finland and offers landscapes of snow, forests, hills and tundra. It is the land of reindeer and the Sami people, whose culture has deep roots in the region. During the long winter nights, the Northern Lights may appear. In summer, the opposite happens: the sun stays above the horizon for weeks.

Baltic Archipelago

Finland's southwestern coast is made up of thousands of islands, islets and small rocks scattered across the Baltic Sea. Among them are forests, coastal villages and summer cottages. Many islands are connected by bridges or ferries, while others remain practically wild. This huge archipelago makes the Finnish coastline one of the most unique maritime landscapes...
